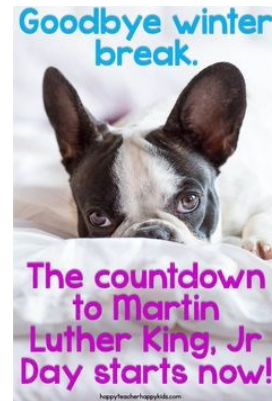

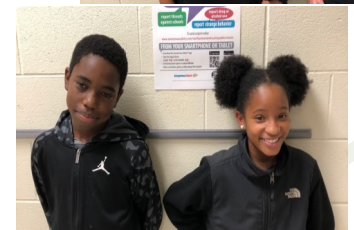
OCTOBER STUDENTS OF THE MONTH
