




On the Road to Literacy

The students feedback was extremely important in helping to determine at the VDOE and USDA level which items should be featured on future school menus. 






The Next Chapter

He is always one to give back to the community, he has been offering "Prime Tyme Developmental Summer Basketball Camp" to local youth for over 25 years. 
