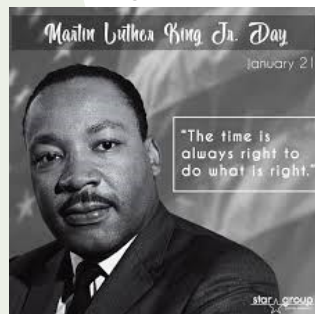

NMS AGAINST BULLYING



Report urgent student concerns quickly to school officials



This year, NMS will be taking a better stand against bullying. We will treat everyone with respect and be polite. Stop and think before we say or do something that could hurt someone. Keep in mind that everyone is different. Not better or worse. Just different. We may think of one specific form of

bullying when the word comes to mind. But, bullying exists in a multitude of ways. Forms of bullying include cyberbullying, physical bullying, verbal bullying and social bullying. Telling an adult when you see bullying is doing what's right. Whether you're the victim of bullying or you're a bystander, it takes guts to open up about the situation or report it to an authority. Speak out and correct the situation - and others'.

Our school has an Anonymously Alerts student bullying and safety reporting system to help combat negative activity. It empowers students to come forward to help themselves and others. Students or parents in the school community can anonymously submit alerts about suspicious activity, safety threats, bullying, alcohol or drug use, depression, harassment, family issues, gun violence/threat, weapons brought to school or discussed about using them, campus safety concerns and self-harm issues to school administrators. Students who **See Something, Do Something** anonymously using the mobile applications and Web-based reporting system. With Anonymous Alerts, students can maintain their anonymity and feel confident that someone will

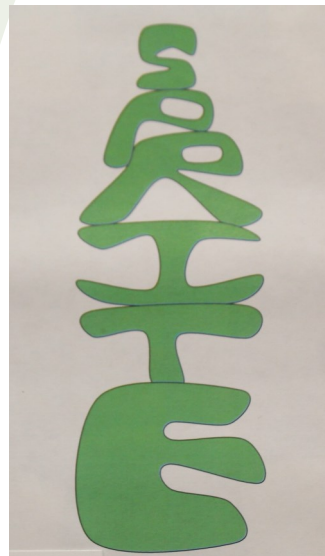
7th Grade: Oyster Shell Dragon Eyes

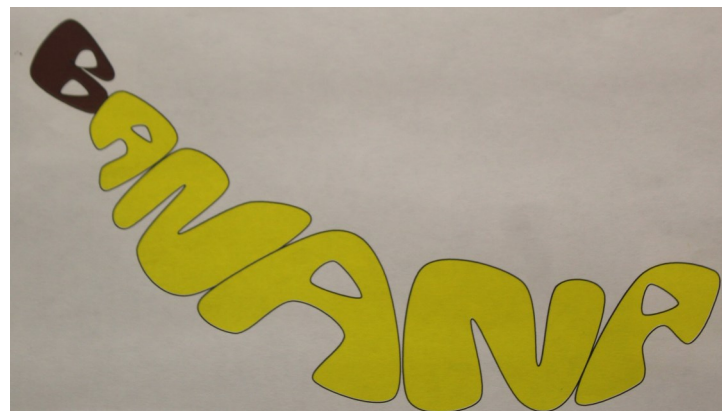
Students learned how to use Google Draw. It allowed students to create diagrams, shapes, and other drawings that they can later use in Google Docs.

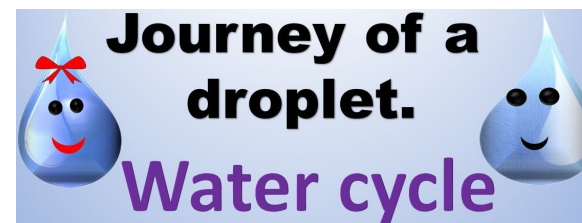

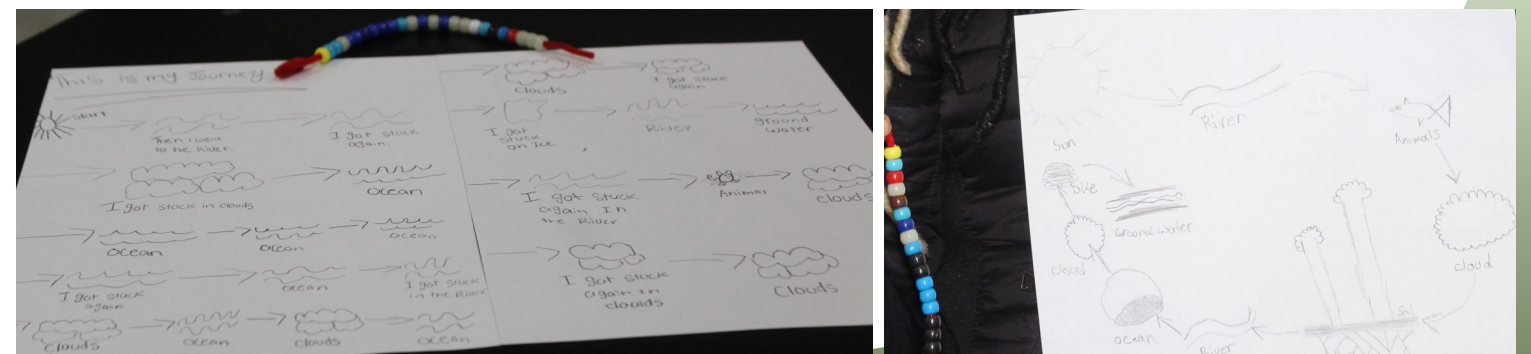
OYSTER INTERNAL ANATOMY



Mr. Dawson's 6th grade science class learned how to identify the various parts of the oyster's internal anatomy. They had live oysters that were shucked in class by representatives from the Chesapeake Bay Maritime Museum. Students used magnifying glass, tweezers, dissecting tray and paper towels. The students first oriented their oyster so that the hinge was pointed toward them. They carefully fold back the mantle to locate the gills. They observed the adductor muscle; located the palps that lead to the stomach; located the oyster's rectum and anus; and lastly, located the heart which lies just below the adductor muscle. If their oyster was still alive, they observed the heart beating!



Mr. Dawson's 6th grade science class learned about the water cycle. The students tracked their water journey by recording each step on a list and made a bracelet with beads representing each step along the way. This was a fun and highly visible way to see and compare the different pathways that a water molecule might take through the water cycle.



PEACE POSTER CONTEST

The Lion Clubs sponsors the International Peace Posters Contest which was created in 1988 to give young people the opportunity to creatively express their feelings for world peace and to share their vision with the world. While overcoming new challenges brought on by an unprecedented global pandemic, recognizing the things that keep us connected—to each other, to our communities, all together around the world. This year, NMS was invited to envision, explore and visually express these connections. On November 9, 2021, the Northumberland Lions members, Michael Stevenson and Rita Johnson judged the posters on their originality, artistic merit, and expression of the theme, "We Are All Connected". OUTDOOR LEARNING

The TAG students traveled to Belle Isle State Park located in Lancaster, VA, for a day of outdoor learning—one group went on Friday, October 15, 2021 and the next group went on Friday, December 3, 2021. The park has seven miles of shoreline on the Northern Neck's Rappahannock River and provides access to Mulberry and Deep creeks. There are eight distinct types of wetlands within the park. The diverse ecosystems makes Belle Isle an excellent outdoor laboratory for environmental education that the Chesapeake Bay Foundation (CBF) educators shared with the students. The students did a pollution scavenger hunt, water testing, net seining, logging of species, identifying of trees, undisturbed listening in their natural surroundings, a picnic in canoes, and manual labor loading and unloading canoes. The CBF field programs give students a unique opportunity to learn about and interact with the Chesapeake Bay. They enjoyed the CBF educators and it was a beautiful autumn day to learn outside! 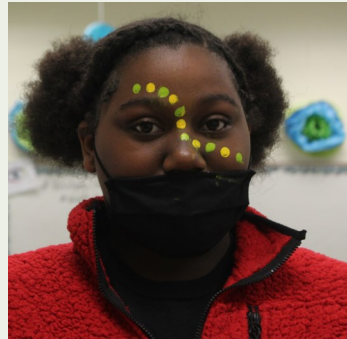

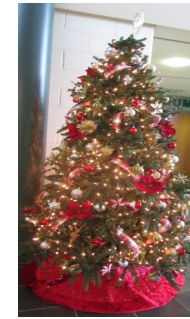
