PRINCIPAL'S CORNER




Hello Northumberland families-

Report urgent student concerns quickly to school officials





Speaking out against bullying takes courage, assertiveness, compassion and leadership. Students who See Something, Do Something anonymously using the mobile applications and Webbased reporting system. With Anonymous Alerts, students can maintain their anonymity and feel confident that someone will handle the issue.














NMS TEACHER OF THE YEAR SHANITA CURRY CONTINUED...



WARS OF INDEPENDENCE



Mrs. Felton's 6th grade History class learned about the wars of independence from Mr. James Russell. He talked to the students about the Revolutionary War, the War of 1812 and the American Civil War. Mr. Russell said his grandmother, Gladys Sandy Edwards, encouraged him to learn about their family's rich history. He said, "She was the one who made history come alive for me; she would tell me stories about family members who played a role". He became interested in the wars when he was about six years old. He shared with the students artifacts he has collected over the years, such as canteen, cannon ball and bullets. The students were very interested and asked a lot of good questions. Mr. Russell said, "We must know our history and understand where and how events made history, or we are doomed to repeat the same mistakes". Mr. Russell's 3rd great grandfather, Captain William Edwards served in the Revolutionary War from 1774 - 1781 and his father served in World War II, Korea and Vietnam. Mr. Russell's father was a young Lieutenant he parachuted into Normandy late on June 5, 1944, as a pathfinder. He also served with the 187th Airborne Regimental Combat team in Korea. Mr. Russell was asked if he served in the military and he said, "I was a Marine," then seconds later he said, "I am a Marine." Thank you Mr. Russell for sharing and making history come alive for our students.




